In serious or urgent cases Ofcom may give a direction suspending or restricting a provider's entitlement to provide ECNs or ECSs, and it may require a provider to pay compensation to its customers (sections 98 and 100, Communications Act). Providing an ECN or ECS in breach of a direction is a criminal offence.
