New guidelines state that all women 21 and over should get their first smear. The pap smear doesn't only check for STDs-- it checks for abnormal changes of the cells in the cervix. These pap checks help prevent cervical cancer in women. After your first pap smear, if results are normal, then you should be expecting another every 2 years.

### **Pap Smear New Guidelines: Does it pertain to Virgins ...**

Have a Pap test alone every 3 years; Have an HPV test alone every 5 years; If you are 65 years or older—You do not need screening if you have no history of cervical changes and either three negative Pap test results in a row or two negative co-test results in a row within the past 10 years, with the most recent test performed within the past 5 years.

New recommendations from the American Cancer Society now emphasize HPV tests over Pap smears for cervical cancer screening. The guidelines also raise the age for initial screening from 21 to 25.

### **Why HPV Tests Preferred to Pap Smears for Cervical Cancer ...**

For women age 30 or older, both HPV/Pap cotesting and HPV testing alone are more sensitive than Pap testing alone. Therefore, a woman with a negative HPV test and normal Pap test—or just a negative HPV test—has a very low risk of developing precancerous cervical lesions over the next several years. It is for that reason that, when Pap and HPV cotesting or HPV testing alone are used, the ...

### **HPV and Pap Testing - National Cancer Institute**

CDC Guidelines for Pap Smear and HPV Testing. In 2018, the CDC announced new guidelines for Pap smear and HPV testing. As per the new guidelines: Women within the age group of 30-65 years are urged to get a Pap smear every three years, HPV testing every five years, or a combination of these two tests every five years.

### **What are the New CDC Guidelines Around Pap Smears - Nurx**

Continue surveillance with HPV testing or cotesting at 3-year intervals for at least 25 years (recommended) >25 years is acceptable “for as long as the patient’s life expectancy and ability to be screened are not significantly compromised by serious health issues”. HPV assays.

### **The New ASCCP Management Consensus Guidelines for Abnormal ...**

The guidelines generally advise a reduction in the number of tests women get over their lifetime to better ensure that they receive the benefits of testing while minimizing the harms, and include a preference for co-testing using the Pap test and HPV test for women age ages 30 to 65.

### **New Guidelines For Cervical Cancer Screening Could End The ...**

Those aged 25 to 65 should have a primary HPV test\* every 5 years. If primary HPV testing is not available, screening may be done with either a co-test that combines an HPV test with a Papanicolaou (Pap) test every 5 years or a Pap test alone every 3 years. (\*A primary HPV test is an HPV test that is done by itself for screening.
