Cesarean Birth (C-Section) Nursing Care and Management

Assess the newborn and provide initial nursing care is one of the key parts of nursing interventions. Administer oxytocin as order and indicated after placental expulsion. Instruct woman to push when sings of placenta separation apparent. Carefully examine placenta and fetal membranes for intactness.

When managing the care of a woman in the second stage of labor, the nurse uses various measures to enhance the progress of fetal descent. These measures include: A. Encouraging the woman to try various upright positions, including squatting and standing. B. Telling the woman to start pushing as soon as her cervix is fully dilated.
